## Binding Elements of a Single Triad/Seventh Chord in Four-Part Tonal Harmony

- 1. Uses the Grand Staff
- 2. Uses four voices:

Soprano - highest voice, uses treble clef (stem(s) up)
Alto - lower voice of treble clef uses treble clef, (stem(s) down)
Tenor - higher voice of bass clef, uses bass clef (stem(s) up)
Bass - lowest voice, uses bass clef (stem(s) down)

3. Usually stays in specific ranges (maintains smooth, connected texture):

Soprano – C4 TO G5 Alto – G3 to D5 Tenor – C3 to G4 Bass – E2 to C4

4. Spacing: refers to intervals between consecutive voices (also maintains smooth, connected texture):

Bass to Tenor: Up to two octaves Tenor to Alto: No more than an octave Alto to Soprano: No more than an octave

5. Open and Closed Position: refers to the interval between the tenor and soprano

Open: **An** octave or more Closed: Less then an octave

6. Voice crossing: Avoided in this style... When (for example) the bass is higher then the tenor; the soprano is lower then alto; etc.
